1. Fáinne Geal an Lae (Daybreak)

Offering a whisper of an old Irish Song. I imagine the first light of a new day, breaking over the horizon.

2. Tha Mi Sgìth (I am Weary)

From Scotland, this wonderful melody tells the tale of a heartbroken Fairy King who is forbidden to marry his mortal love and condemned to spend eternity pulling the weeds from his Fairy mound.

3. Idir Eatarthu (Between Worlds)

Inspired by an ancient Celtic term describing a transitional or transformative space that is neither one place nor another, but the space between the two. Particularly apt for the world we currently live in.

4. Cailleach na gCrann (The Tree Witch)

The lyrics for this song are the names of Celtic trees sung in Irish. In the Forest near my home there are a number of ancient trees that I regularly visit and appreciate. Beith gheal (Birch), Caorthann (Rowan), Fearn (Alder), Saileach (Willow), Fuinseog (Ash), Sceach gheal (Hawthorn), Dair (Oak), Cuileann (Holly), Coll (Hazel), Úll (Apple), Muin (Vine), Gort (Ivy), Biorrach (Reed), Draighnean donn (Blackthorn), Ruis (Elder).

5. Port na bPúcaí (Song of the Pookas)

One of the blessings of 2020 was finding the online masterclasses of the legendary Irish Fiddler, Martin Hayes. I have had the great privilege of studying with Martin and this track is inspired by his playing. Originally from the Blasket Islands, the story goes that a fiddler heard this tune on the waves one night and sang it all night until he had it memorized.

6. Donnachadh Bán (Pale Donnacha)

A sister's lament for her brother Donnacha, who was hanged unjustly by the English. Inspired by the singing of Darach Ó Cathain.

7. Ag Teacht in Aois (Coming of Age)

There are very few rituals in our western society. This piece marks a young person's transition from being a child to being an adult.

8. Solstice

I have always been fascinated by the summer and winter solstices, which are the turning points in the solar year. This piece is my vision of ritualistic possibilities.

9. Dóín Dú (Dotie Potie)

An old Irish love song, there is no real translation for the title, which is a term of endearment, so I added a family equivalent. The amazing sean-nós singer Saileog Ní Cheannabháin gave me this tune.

10. Ancestors

A blessing and honouring of our ancestors who gave us the gift of life.

11. Anam Chara (Soul Friend)

A love song for my Darling.

12. Reconciliation

An original composition expressing the forgiveness and acceptance that hopefully occurs after a difference in opinion.

13. Misty Mountain

Imagined music from an envisioned ancient place.

14. Ritual Fire

Regardless of culture, all our ancestors would have participated in Fire Rituals, gathering around a fire to dance, grieve, sing and celebrate the cycle of life.
